Kaizen

Kaizen is an effective approach that promotes continuous improvement, emphasizing the significance of incremental positive changes. This approach is based on cooperation and commitment, in contrast to radical or top-down changes that may cause disruptions. I mention this as a follow on from my comments in the last newsletter about the importance of persistence and 'pressing on.' On Thursday I attended the rippa rugby tournament where we had four teams. After the first game with one of the teams I suggested they worked on an aspect of their play in order to improve. One of the students asked if I thought they weren't any good? Ah, no. What I was suggesting was they should reflect on how they played the game and figure out one area they could improve upon and implement this in their next game.

Top athletes are top athletes, amongst other reasons, because they practice for hours and hours a day. They remain top athletes because they continue to work on their deliberate practice for hours and hours a day. While I am not for one minute suggesting our students should participate in such a regime, I am suggesting that being open to reflecting on where improvements can be made and then working to improve should be part of their training.

The same applies to schools. Good schools, wishing to become great schools, have at their core a commitment to continually improve through reflection, analysis and planning. More of this next week but for the moment, the notion of kaizen, working toward continuous improvement, should be part of everything we do.

Road Safety Around Schools

A reminder to our school community to observe the 40 km max speed limits around schools and borrow a phrase being used by the Police at present – 'speed limits are a maximum speed allowed, not a target'. Can we also ask parents, whānau, and friends to park safely and legally around our school at pick-up and drop-off times? We continue to see cars parked or stopping on yellow lines and at bus stops, or in the limited time zone areas at the back gate, all of which are clearly marked to be kept clear. This is about your child and our students' safety.

Finally, we have noticed a number of cars carrying out u-turns or three-point turns in front of the school. **This is highly dangerous**. and compromises the safety of children on the crossing and the footpaths, as well as other traffic on the road. On Tuesday morning a driver almost hit one of our children while reversing as part of a three-point turn. Please consider the whole area in front of the school a **no-turning zone**. You can easily drive along to Tamahere Rd to complete your maneuver.

WALKING SCHOOL BUS



We now have 19 kids walking on the Capilano and Roberts Road walking school bus. We would love more.

What is a Walking School Bus? It's an organised group of children who walk to and from school along a designated route, under the supervision of adult volunteers. Children are 'picked up' and 'dropped off' at specific walking school bus 'bus stops'. Walking School Buses (WSBs) reduce the number of cars on the road, making our environment safer and cleaner, and they provide exercise for kids in a fun and social way.
