Always Improving

The concept of kaizen (continually changing for the better being something good), referenced in the newsletter last week, is a practice that should be embedded in schools. The Education Review office (ERO) exhorts schools to scrutinise information and to be 'explicit and relentless' in the quest for improving outcomes for students. Students achieving their potential should be the focus of every school and every teacher should be supported to make this objective a reality.

As mentioned last week, this quest does not have to cause massive upheavals. Rather, adhering to the key features of kaizen, there should be:

- Improvements based on many small changes rather than the radical changes that might arise from other sources.
- Ideas for improvement come from the teachers and school employees themselves.
- Ideas come from the talents of the existing workforce, as opposed to using research, consultants
 or equipment, although outside experts should be used to assist in improving practice when the
 expertise does not currently reside within the school.
- That all employees should continually be seeking ways to improve their own performance.

Encouraging members of the staff to take ownership of change can help reinforce team working, thereby improving motivation. None of this is proverbial rocket science. It simply requires a culture where members of the school's team work in a reflective manner where improvement is something that happens in a trusting and supportive environment. This culture of self improvement applies to all walks of life. Even ancient principals should be looking to improve as there is clear evidence that there is abundant room for improvement. (Just ask my dearly beloved).

New Reading Resources for Windy Ridge School

Last week we received the fantastic news that the school's Board of Trustees has agreed to provide significant additional funding support to go towards extra resourcing for Structured Literacy. This means that the school will be able to purchase a range of Senior Decodable Texts to help inspire and engage even the most reluctant of readers. The cost is \$9,500.

In addition, the funding has been granted by the Board to enable the school to have two members of staff trained as Structured Literacy Intervention Specialists to provide targeted Literacy learning

support to the students who need it. The cost is \$6,500.

This is a huge step forward for the school and an outstanding win for our students. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of all staff who are on this learning journey to provide evidence based literacy teaching for our Tamariki. Without their efforts, and the financial backing and commitment of the Board of Trustees to support the school's move to Structured Literacy we would not be seeing the improved Literacy results we are seeing today.

Road Safety Around Schools

A reminder to our school community to observe the 40 km max speed limits around schools and borrow a phrase being used by the Police at present – 'speed limits are a maximum speed allowed, not a target'. Can we also ask parents, whānau, and friends to park safely and legally around our school at pick-up and drop-off times? We continue to see cars parked or stopping on yellow lines and at bus stops, or in the limited time zone areas at the back gate, all of which are clearly marked to be kept clear. This is about your child and our students' safety.

Finally, we have noticed a number of cars carrying out u-turns or three-point turns in front of the school. **This is highly dangerous**. and compromises the safety of children on the crossing and the footpaths, as well as other traffic on the road. On Tuesday morning a driver almost hit one of our children while reversing as part of a three-point turn. Please consider the whole area in front of the school a **no-turning zone**. You can easily drive along to Tamahere Rd to complete your maneuver.

WALKING SCHOOL BUS



We now have 19 kids walking on the Capilano and Roberts Road walking school bus. We would love more.

What is a Walking School Bus? It's an organised group of children who walk to and from school along a designated route, under the supervision of adult volunteers. Children are 'picked up' and 'dropped off' at specific walking school bus 'bus stops'. Walking School Buses (WSBs) reduce the number of cars on the road, making our environment safer and cleaner, and they provide exercise for kids in a fun and social way.

We cater for all children's cricket from Year 1 through to Year 8, both girls and boys.


