Lateness / Open Door Policy

Katoa, Ka Ora Draft Speed Management Plan for Auckland

Legislation requires safe speed limits around all schools by 2027

Auckland Transport (AT) is seeking public feedback on the draft Katoa, Ka Ora: Auckland speed management plan 2024-27.

Katoa, Ka Ora (KKO) means everyone alive, healthy, and well. As a <u>Road to Zero</u> partner, AT wants Auckland's roads to be free from deaths and serious injuries. Although speed is not the only factor in a crash, it determines whether someone is serious injured or killed. No matter whether you drive, walk, cycle or use public transport, everyone deserves to get to where they are going safely.

Road Safety Around Schools

A reminder to our school community to observe the 40 km max speed limits around schools and borrow a phrase being used by the Police at present – 'speed limits are a maximum speed allowed, not a target'. Can we also ask parents, whānau, and friends to park safely and legally around our school at pick-up and drop-off times? We continue to see cars parked or stopping on yellow lines and at bus stops, or in the limited time zone areas at the back gate, all of which are clearly marked to be kept clear. This is about your child and our students' safety.

Finally, we have noticed a number of cars carrying out u-turns or three-point turns in front of the school. **This is highly dangerous**. and compromises the safety of children on the crossing and the footpaths, as well as other traffic on the road. On Tuesday morning a driver almost hit one of our children while reversing as part of a three-point turn. Please consider the whole area in front of the school a **no-turning zone**. You can easily drive along to Tamahere Rd to complete your maneuver.

WALKING SCHOOL BUS



We now have 19 kids walking on the Capilano and Roberts Road walking school bus. We would love more.

What is a Walking School Bus? It's an organised group of children who walk to and from school along a designated route, under the supervision of adult volunteers. Children are 'picked up' and 'dropped off' at specific walking school bus 'bus stops'. Walking School Buses (WSBs) reduce the number of cars on the road, making our environment safer and cleaner, and they provide exercise for kids in a fun and social way.



We cater for all children's cricket from Year 1 through to Year 8, both girls and boys.


