

Junky Monkeys is a loose parts play programme that operates in schools, kura, and ECE centres around Tāmaki Makaurau. We bring a truck load of very clean JUNK (aka loose parts), for kids to PLAY, CREATE, and MAKE with.

Junky Monkeys exists to connect kids with NATURE, CREATIVITY, and PLAY by:

- spending time outdoors in nature
- opportunities to learn through play and experiential learning
- time and space to practise skills such as problem solving, divergent and creative thinking, innovation, collaboration, and social and emotional skills
- hands on experience that creates dialogue around waste management
- feeling empowered by having choice and agency over how they spend their time playing

We are so grateful to be sharing the love of loose parts play with your tamariki, kaiako and community. Our dream is that this may kick start your own loose parts play journey so that kids have access to play and loose parts on a daily basis! 'We don't stop playing because we grow old; we grow old because we stop playing.'


